1. RELEVANT INFORMATION ABOUT CAMBODIA




- Located in the southern portion of the Indo-China Peninsula.

- GDP per capita: USD 1,040 (current price 2013)
- Agriculture: 31.6% to GDP, employ bout 64.6% of the total labor force in 2013
- Rice and other cereals were the major agricultural exported products
- Rice export 2015: > 538,000 MT, with high annual growth rate





The Poipet-Aranyaprathet border is situated in the northwest of Cambodia locating in Ou Chrov district, Banteay Meanchey province. It became an official International Border Checkpoint in 1994.

Bavet Border

The Bavet-Moc Bai border: Southeast of Cambodia and it is the primary land crossing for people and goods moving between Cambodia and Vietnam. At present, the most commodities being exported through this border are agriculture and light industrial goods. Bicycles, garments, and shoe products comprise a large percentage of exports as these goods are produced in the nearby special economic zone.

Port of Sihanouk vile

The Sihanouk ville Autonomous Port (PAS) is the only deep sea port in Cambodia accounting for approximately 70% of Cambodia's international cargo. It has over 1,000 employees and workers and the main exports at PAS are agricultural products.

Phnom Penh International Airport (PPIA)

The PPIA is located 10km from downtown Phnom Penh on Road # 4 (Russian Blvd). PPIA cargo facilities include mechanical handling, air-conditioned storage, refrigerated and deep freeze storage, fresh meat inspection, livestock handling, security for dangerous goods and very large/heavy cargo.

Shipping document & Freight forwarders and customs brokers?

Shipping document prepared by export company or freight forwarder include:

- ✓ Airway Bill: issued by an airline and waybill travels with the cargo
- ✓ Authorization Letter
- ✓ Bill of loading: prepared by carrier or forwarder
- ✓ Commercial Invoice: prepared by exporter/freight forwarder
- ✓ Insurance Certificate: prepared by exporter/freight forwarder
- ✓ Packing List

Export documentation issued by Customs and other relevant Ministries:

- 1. Certificate of Origin
- 2. Customs Declaration
- 3.Export License
- 4.Export Permit: Controlled by relevant Government authorities.


How many Freight Forwarder in Cambodia?

Five (5) categories of goods subject to Export Taxes:

1. Unprocessed Rubber

- 2. Uncut (unprocessed) Precious Stones
- 3. Processed Wood
- 4. Fish and Crustaceans, Mollusks and Other Aquatic Products
- 5. Sand
- Export below 1000\$/Ton, Free duty rate
- Export between >1000\$-<2000 \$/Ton, duty rate is 50\$/Ton
- Export between >2000\$ -<3000\$/Ton duty rate is 150\$/Ton
- Export between >3000\$ -<4000\$/Ton, duty rate is 200\$/Ton
- Export between > 4000\$/Ton, duty rate is 300\$/Ton
